

## Minutes of the WAFTA AGM 2025

1. **Apologies** – Dai Hicks, Simon Poulter, Richard Beaugie
2. **Minutes of OGM** held on the 8th November 2023 were agreed as being a true record of the meeting. Proposed B/Gwent. Seconded Castleton
3. **Officers Reports.** The Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, Competition Secretary and Grading Officer submitted reports which were read out to the meeting. Copies of the reports are appended below. The Treasurers report has not been appended to these minutes as they will be on public view within the WAFTA Website but are held by club reps and can be viewed on request by members.
4. **Election of officers.**  
Current Officers are:  
Chairman – John Johnston – Re-elected, but will stand down at end of the year.  
Vice Chairman – Mark Bassett – Re-elected  
Secretary – John Easterbrook – Re-elected  
Treasurer – David Hicks – Re-elected  
Competitions Secretary – Mark Bassett – Re-elected  
Web Manager – John Johnston – David Hicks to take over role from John.  
Grading Officer – Mark Bassett – Re-elected
5. **WTSF update.** Sports Wales provides funding to the WTSF, which in turn gives funding to WAFTA, thanks to John Johnston sitting on the committee. Sports Wales gives the funding as, in the past, shooting events have taken place in the Commonwealth Games with many medals being won by the Welsh team. However, the next Commonwealth Games in Scotland will not host ant shooting events. This may threaten the level of funding that WAFTA is able to receive. Further updates will be provided when available.  
John Johnston also stated that he wished to step down from his role in the WTSF and is looking for a Volunteer to take over.
6. **Finances of WAFTA. Raised by Nelson.** A concern over the source of income for the WAFTA finances in the future has been confirmed by the WTSF update. Currently WAFTA depends on this grant, however, it is possible that this could cease completely. It was therefore agreed that WAFTA needs to be able to fund itself.

1. The first suggestion was to scrap the raffle. Proposed by Castleton, seconded by Blaenau Gwent. All in favour.
  
2. Entry fee to remain £10 per head. If attendance of any shoot is over 25 entrants £2 per entrant is to be paid to WAFTA. Clubs to pay for badges as before. Juniors pay £5. New policy to begin at the start of the 2025 Summer series.  
Proposed by Nelson, seconded by Blaenau Gwent. All in favour
  
7. **Supported with sticks.** From October OGM. Castleton provided a minimum height requirement of 450mm from cradle to bottom of stick. Proposed by Castleton, seconded by Blaenau Gwent. All in favour.
  
8. **WAFTA Summer series shoot dates.** See attached spreadsheet.
  
9. **Trophies for the Winter series** . As a result of the uncertain financial future of WAFTA it was decided to remain as is. Trophies for first place only in each category. To be reviewed again at the next AGM. Proposed by Blaenau Gwent, seconded by Nelson. All in favour

10. **A.O.B.**

BFTA card holders names to be submitted to John Johnston by the end of January

Grand Slam to be held at Blaenau Gwent on 23<sup>rd</sup> February. Jack Harris to organise.

A new grade of Stick Class to be commenced for the 2025 Summer series. The ungraded class to be dropped and revert to the previous workings. New shooters compete in C class for the first 3 shoots and then get graded accordingly. Proposed by Nelson, seconded by Blaenau Gwent. All in favour

WAFTA bank account to be audited after Euros. Raised by Castleton. Response by Nelson stating that the accounts are available if required.

So, we will have to select and get a new director appointed, as this role is critical for our sport. Any one interested can join me at the next WTSF OGM to gain some insight as to what this role involves.

I have served as chairman of WAFTA since 2015, and as I stated at the last AGM, I wish to relinquish this role at the AGM in 2026. I will of course be available to assist my successor(s) with any issues in future.
